I am writing to you as the leader of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA), representing more than 400,000 pilots/members nationwide, with over 30,000 living in Florida. These people, many of them your neighbors, use General Aviation (GA) for personal and business transportation. GA aircraft also provide a wide range of vital services like medevac, crop dusters, news and police helicopters. They utilize a network of 5,400 public use airports in this country, opposed to the less than 600 airports with commercial air carrier service. For more than half a century one of these airports, Witham Field, has been an important part of the Stuart community. In that time it has been a significant contributor to the area's economic strength

In the upcoming election there are candidates painting a negative picture of Witham Field as a focal point for

the election. Not surprisingly, a lot of mis-information about the airport and general aviation has been a part of their distorted message.

Witham Field generates tens of millions of dollars in direct economic benefit to this area. Yet general aviation airports like Witham Field do more than just support the local economy. As part of the national air system, each airport is vital link to the rest of the country. Think of it as an interstate in the air; then **imagine** 

what I-95 would be like without any on or off ramps. Hurricane Charley clearly substantiated that GA airports are increasingly essential, especially in times of crisis. Polk County's Lakeland Linder Regional Airport – similar in size to Witham – is serving as the site of major relief efforts by federal, state and county agencies. Thanks to this GA airport, emergency teams are able to fly in with supplies for much-needed disaster recovery efforts. One day, Witham Field may be called

upon to provide this service to you and your neighbors.

Witham Field boasts some of the country's most aggressive anti-noise policies. In fact, your community leaders have worked closely with the Federal Aviation Administration to identify and implement solutions for local noise issues through a process known as the Part 150 noise study. As a result, there is a curfew from 11

PM to 7 AM, among many other effective voluntary actions. In my travels throughout this great country I see many communities that would do anything to develop an

airport with all the assets your community and the federal government have invested in Witham Field. GA has been – and will continue to be – an indispensable partner to local communities like yours. When you go to the polls next week, be sure you vote for the leaders that have your long-term interests in mind.
