

**PROPOSED ESTABLISHMENT  
Of  
Lightning Temporary Military Operations Area (MOA)  
Central Wisconsin**

**AIRSPACE STUDY 14-AGL-01NR**

**SUMMARY:** The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is considering a request by the United States Air Force (USAF) to establish the Lightning Temporary Military Operations Area (MOA) in support of Exercise NORTHERN LIGHTNING 2014. The purpose of this temporary MOA study is to identify and define an airspace area which would contain aircraft conducting military operations. The proposed dimensions, approximately 55 nautical miles by 15 nautical miles, are identical to airspace implemented for the same exercise last year.

The proposed temporary MOA would be effective during the following times:

- June 9-20, 2014, Monday-Friday, from 0830-1100 and 1230-1500 CDT by NOTAM 4 hours in advance

Air Force, Air National Guard, and Marine Corps F-15, F-16, F-18, F-5, KC 135, and E-3 AWACS will conduct Air Interdiction training incorporating dissimilar aircraft in advanced threat scenarios within the proposed Lightning Temporary MOA. Activities will occur between 8,000 feet mean sea level (MSL) to but not including Flight Level 180 (FL 180).

**COMMENTS INVITED:** The purpose of this notice is to invite interested persons to submit in writing any comments they may have regarding the overall aeronautical aspects of the proposal presented in this notice. Comments which provide a factual basis supporting the views and suggestions presented are the most helpful. Persons wishing to comment should submit correspondence to:

Beginning at lat. 44°40'04"N., long. 90°19'33"W.;;  
to lat. 44°35'00"N., long. 90°18'00"W.;;  
to lat. 44°27'00"N., long. 89°59'00"W.;;  
to lat. 44°24'00"N., long. 89°00'00"W.;;  
to the point of beginning
- b. Vertical 8,000' MSL to but not including FL180

**2. TIME OF USE**

0830-1100L and 1230-1500 CDT by NOTAM 4 hours in advance, Monday-Friday; other times by NOTAM; June 9-20, 2014

Contact Minneapolis Air Route Traffic Control Center (ARTCC) for status.

**3. CONTROLLING AGENCY**

FAA, Minneapolis ARTCC, Farmington, Minnesota.

**4. USING AGENCY**

USAF, Air National Guard, Volk Field Combat Readiness Training Center, Wisconsin

**5. MISCELLANEOUS**

Activities. Military aircraft will conduct aggressive three-dimensional maneuvering during simulated Air Interdiction scenarios. Supersonic flight is not authorized in the temporary MOA. Chaff/flares will be employed.

No restrictions will be imposed on nonparticipating Visual Flight Rules (VFR) aircraft. VFR pilots are expected to exercise vigilance while transiting the temporary MOA. They are strongly encouraged to contact the nearest flight service station and request the latest NOTAM information, or contact Minneapolis ARTCC to ascertain the status of the temporary MOA.
